This half term's focus is **Relationships**, where the children will learn about **making friends, belonging**, solve problems, , being kind , managing feelings and how to be a good friend. We will continue to have **circle times** to talk about our feelings and emotions linked to story. Along side this we will be continuing to work on play skills such as **turn taking, sharing, similarities and differences, learning the difference between right and wrong** and personal hygiene.

Year R

Great Britain! – Summer 1 2023;

Here is what the year R children will be experiencing this half term.

Understanding the World

Forest walks will continue this term, our focus being **signs of spring**, and working together to build dens and have team building activities. We will be having a large focus on map work comparing towns to cities using the Town Mouse, Country Mouse book as the hook. We will be exploring Google Earth to look at the differences in land features and following and making our own interactive maps. We will be exploring programming BEEBOTS and making maps for them to navigate. We will also be learning about transport through texts. **St. George's day , Ramadan and Eid, walk to school week, National Nurse awareness day and we will be holding a Royal picnic and celebrating the Kings Coronation.**

Communication and Language

Our book talk this half term will be focusing on identifying the features of the town and the countryside. We will **be taking turns in conversation to listen to each other and respond appropriately**. The children will continue to take turns to hold a presentation assembly where they can learn how to ask questions. In the forest they will describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside

Literacy

We will be introducing the text *Town mouse Country mouse* as the topic hook. We will then use this and other texts to look at geographical features. We will also be looking at *Naughty Bus* to look at transport. In Kinetic letters we will be completing the Fisher, special Squirter and Slider family letters and numbers. We will also introduce snuggled pairs of letters. In Drawing club we are encouraging the children to write in simple sentences applying their sound knowledge and using red words independently (eg the cat on the mat). Please continue to read at home and record these in your child's reading diary.

Red text are SMSC opportunities (Social, moral, social and cultural)



Ideas to support your child in Year R's learning at home

Challenge your child to make a number line to 20. practice jumping an object to show one more or one less.

Use your voice to explore the pitch your voice makes eg loud, quiet, high, low sounds.

Explore Google Earth to look for familiar locations to your family. Are they in the town or in the country? How do they know?

Play a game (phase 2), like- Grab a giggling grapheme, on www.phonicsplay.co.uk

Explore floating and sinking objects (like toys) in a water tray sink or bath.

Practice holding your pencil in the 3 friends hold like this.



Help hang the washing out using pegs to make your finger and hands strong for pencil holding.

Continue to challenge your child to stay reading/ writing in a Strong Lizard, staying longer each time.
